



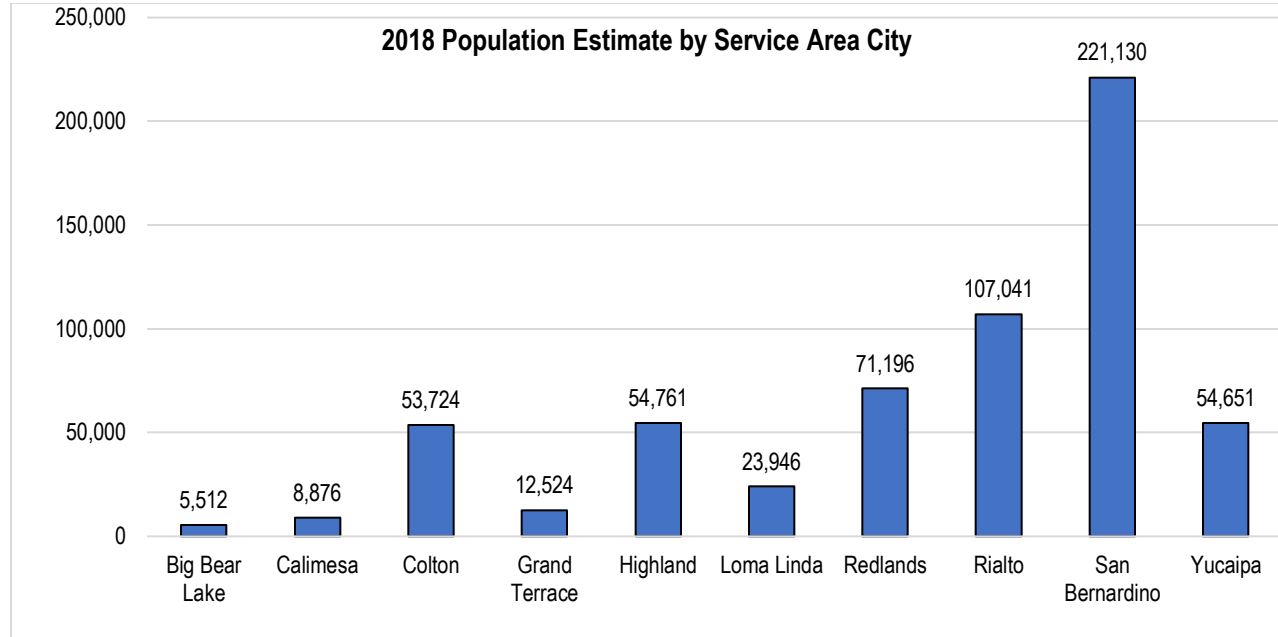

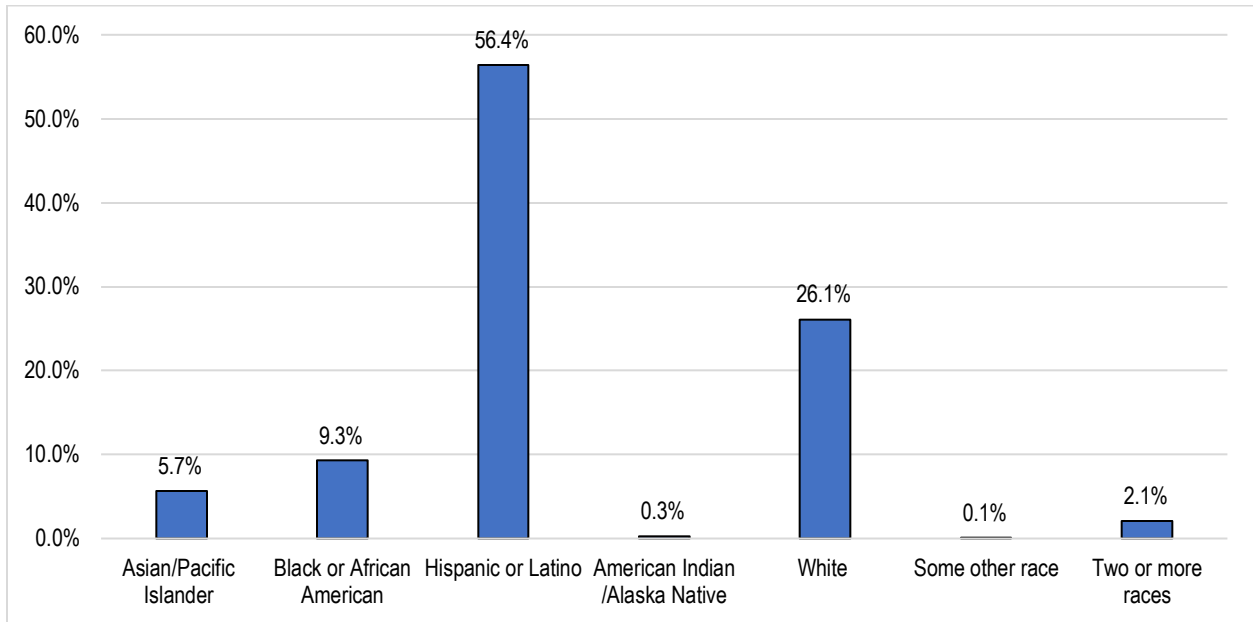

The San Bernardino Community College District service area represents 28% of the total San Bernardino County population. The top 3 cities – San Bernardino, Rialto, and Redlands represent about 65% of the service area population. The service area population grew by 2.4% to 613,361 between 2014 and 2018. Service area cities with the largest numeric growth were San Bernardino (+4,539) and Rialto (+3,465). Fastest growing service area cities are Calimesa (10.5%), Big Bear Lake (4.0%), and Rialto (3.3%).

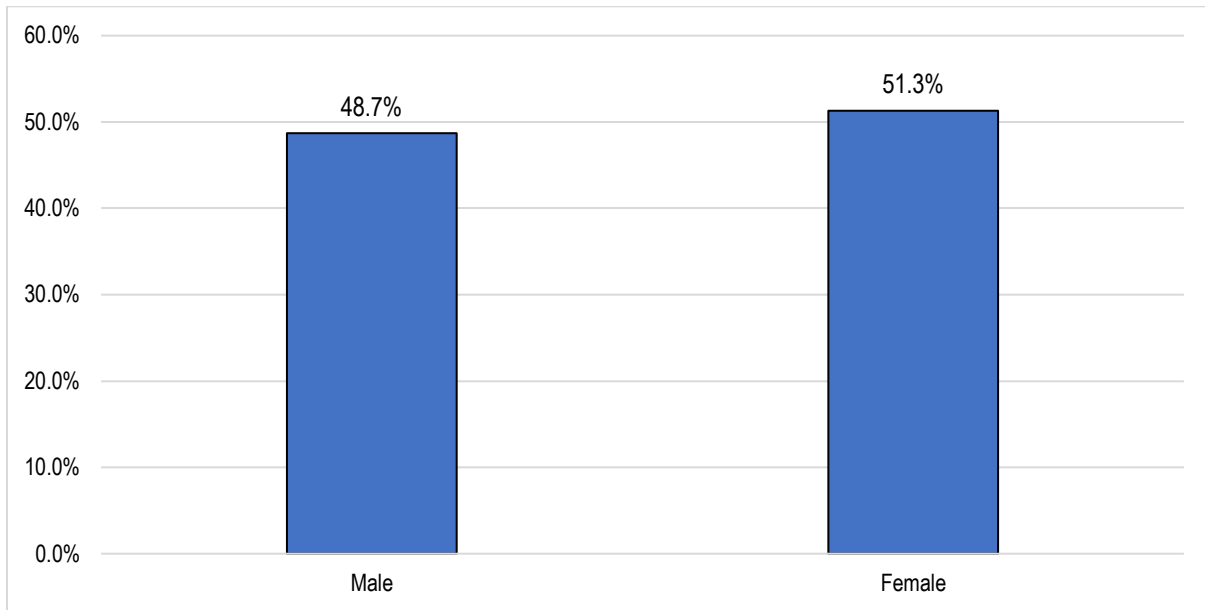

Ethnically, the population of the SBCCD service area cities is 56.4% Hispanic, 26.1% White, 9.3% African American, 5.7% Asian/Pacific Islander, 2.1% Two or More Race, 0.3% American Indians/Alaska Natives, and 0.1% Some other race. In Colton, Rialto, and San Bernardino, more than 60% of the residents are Hispanic. In Big Bear Lake, and Calimesa, more than 60% of the residents are white. In Loma Linda, 27% of the residents are Asian.

Gender Distribution: 2018

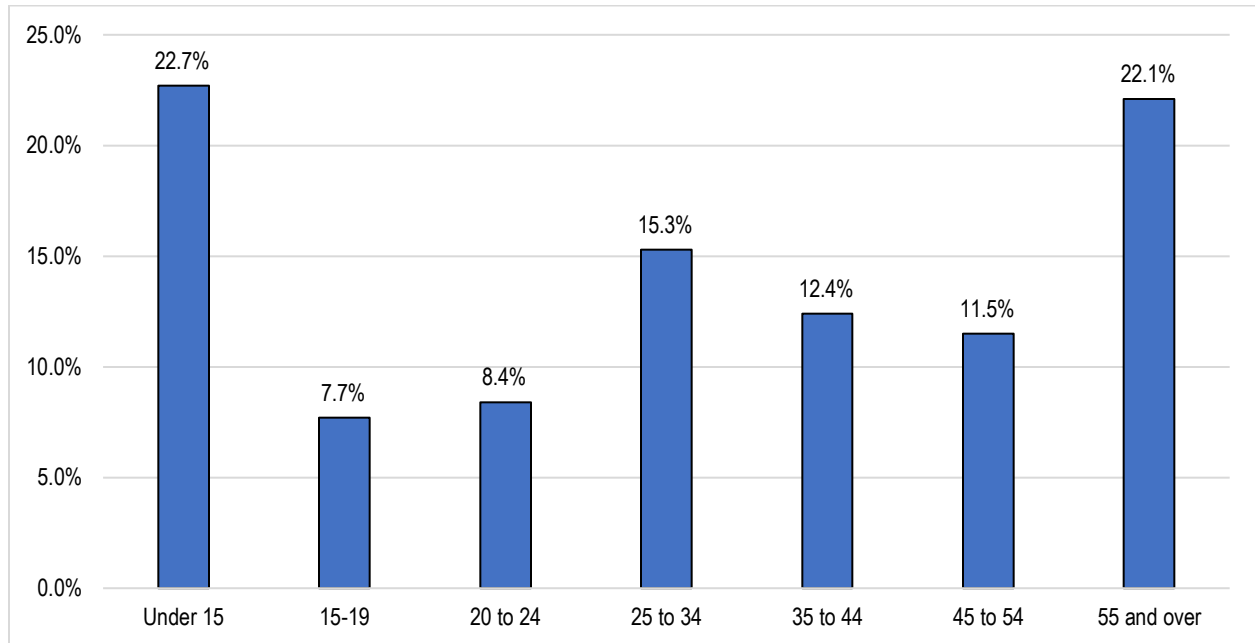

Currently, 51.3% of the SBCCD service area's population is female and 48.7% is male. In 6 cities, there is a slightly higher number of females than males. The service area city with the largest female population is Loma Linda (53.8%), followed by Colton(52.9%), Redlands (52.5%), Big Bear Lakes (52.0%), Grand Terrace (52.0%), and Yucaipa (51.3%).

Age Range Distribution: 2018



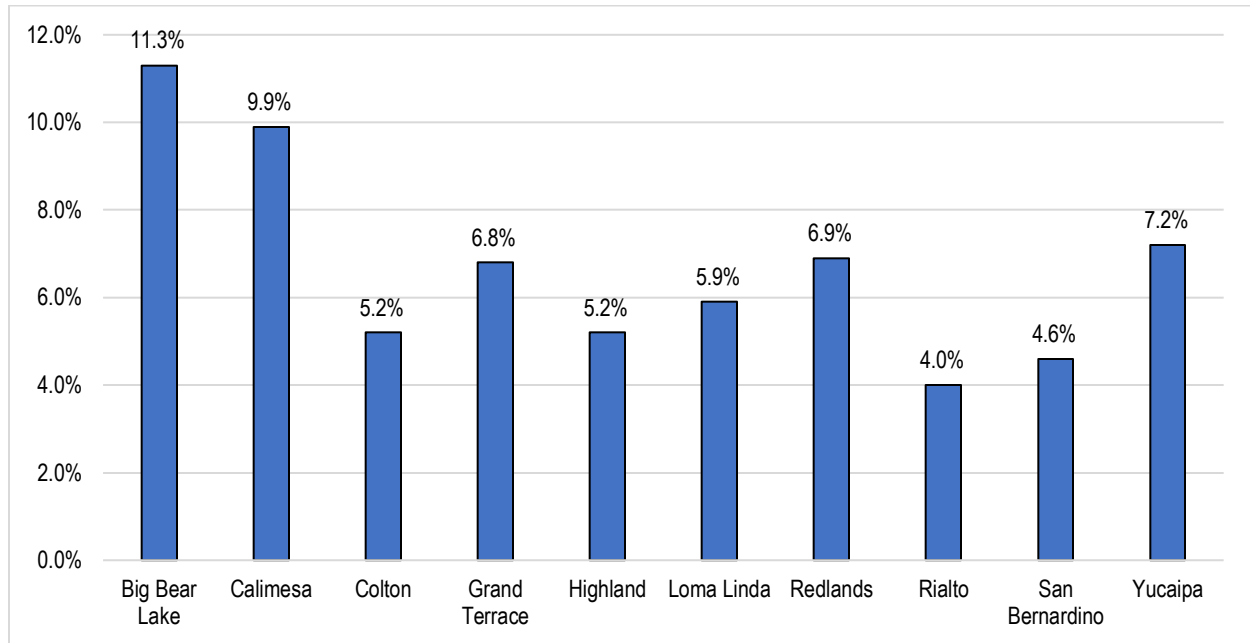

The two largest age groups in the SBCCD's service Area cities are residents under 15 years of age (22.7%) and residents 55 years of age or older (22.0%). Together these ages groups make up nearly 44.7% of the service area population. The median age in the SBCCD service area population is 32.3 years old, which is slightly younger than the county's median age.

The median age in Calimesa is the highest in the service area at 47.6 years. Big Bear's median age of 45.1 years is the next highest. San Bernardino had the lowest median age (29.7 years), followed by Rialto (29.8 years).

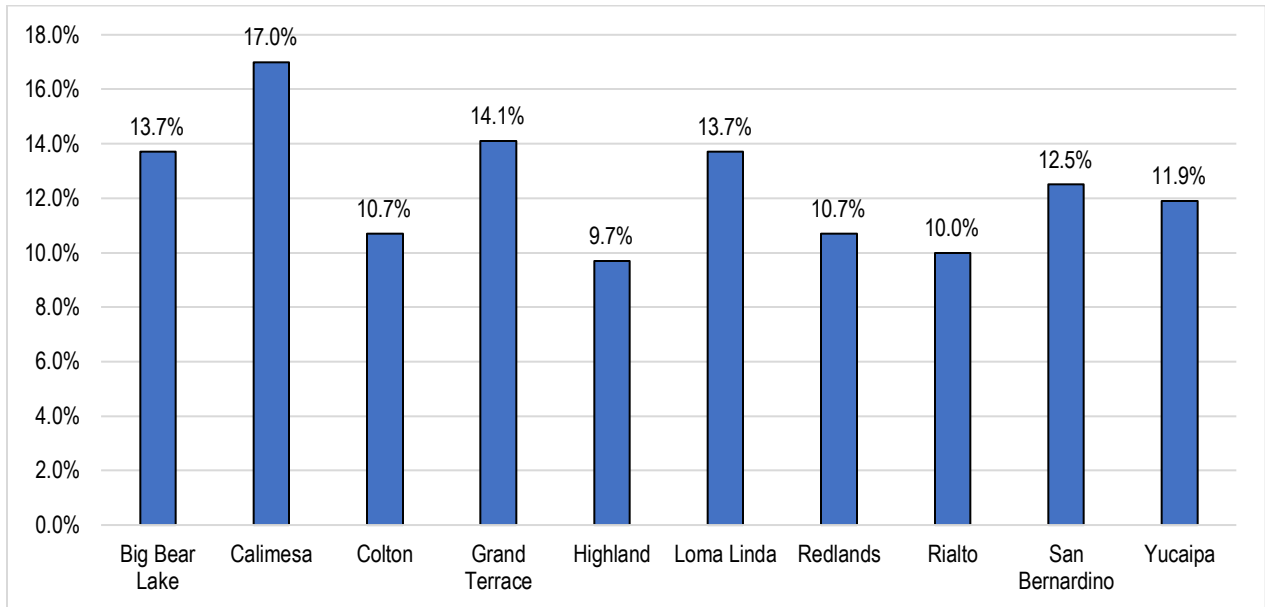

Among the civilian population 18 years and older, 5.4% of the service area population are veterans, which is the same as the state's percentage. The service area city with the highest percentage of veterans is Big Bear Lake (11.3%). Calimesa (9.9%), Yucaipa (7.2%), Redlands (6.9%), and Grand Terrace (6.8%) follow.

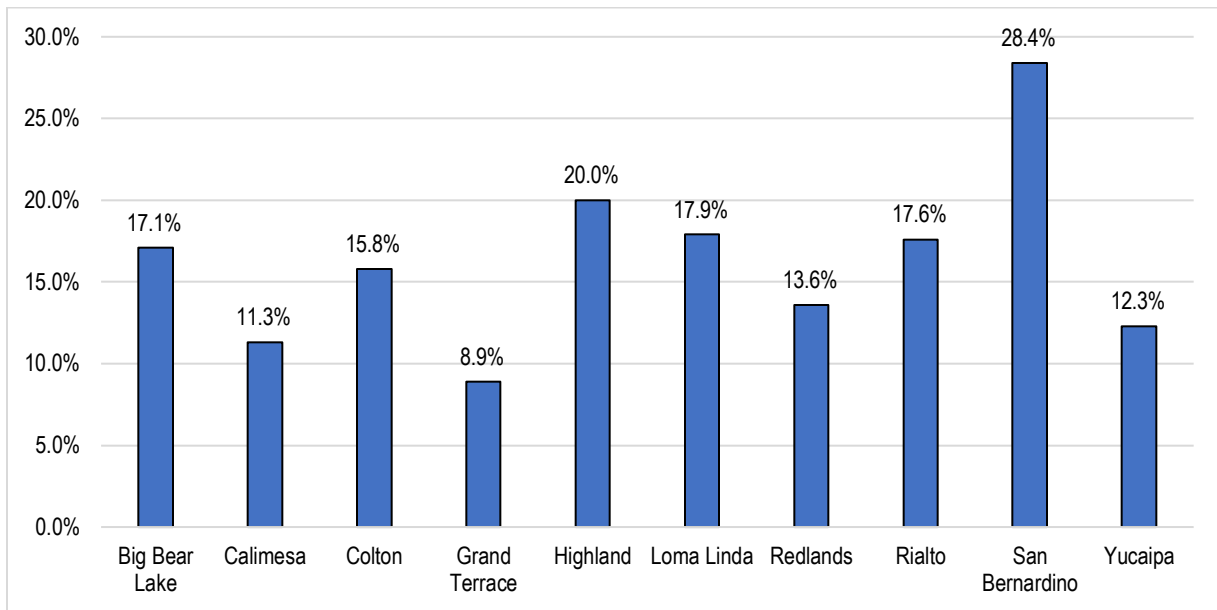

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population, 11.5% of the service area population have a disability. The service area city with the highest percentage of disabled residents is Calimesa (17.0%), as followed by Grand Terrace (14.1%), Big Bear Lake (13.7%), Loma Linda (13.7%), and San Bernardino (12.5%).

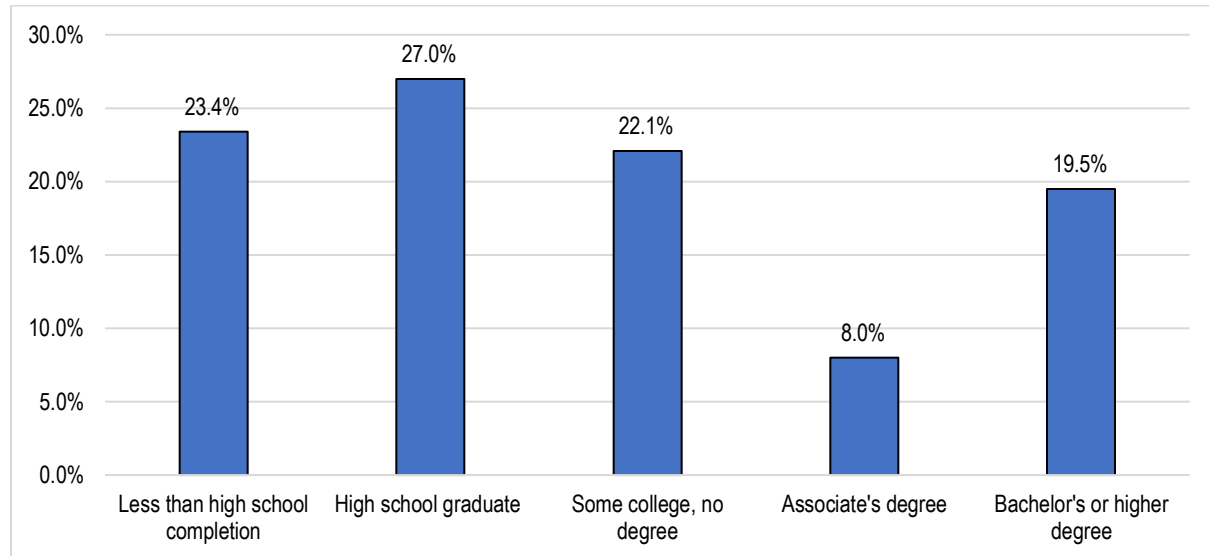

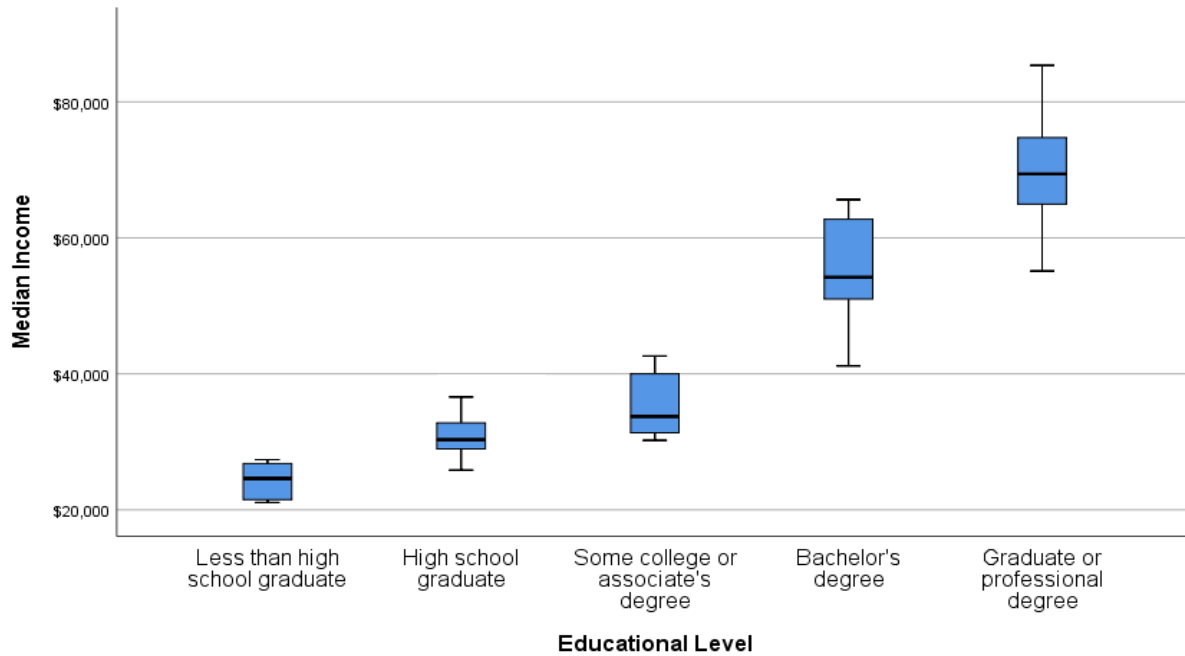

Among adults aged 25 and older, approximately 50% of the service area population have a high school diploma or lower, while 27.5% have a college degree (Associates degree or higher). Over 55% of the residents in Rialto (61.4%), San Bernardino (59.8%), and Colton (54.0%) have a high school diploma or have not completed High School. About 50% of the residents in Loma Linda (54.5%) and Redlands (47.6%) hold college degrees.

Median Annual Earnings by Educational Attainment, Population 25 Years and Over with Earnings

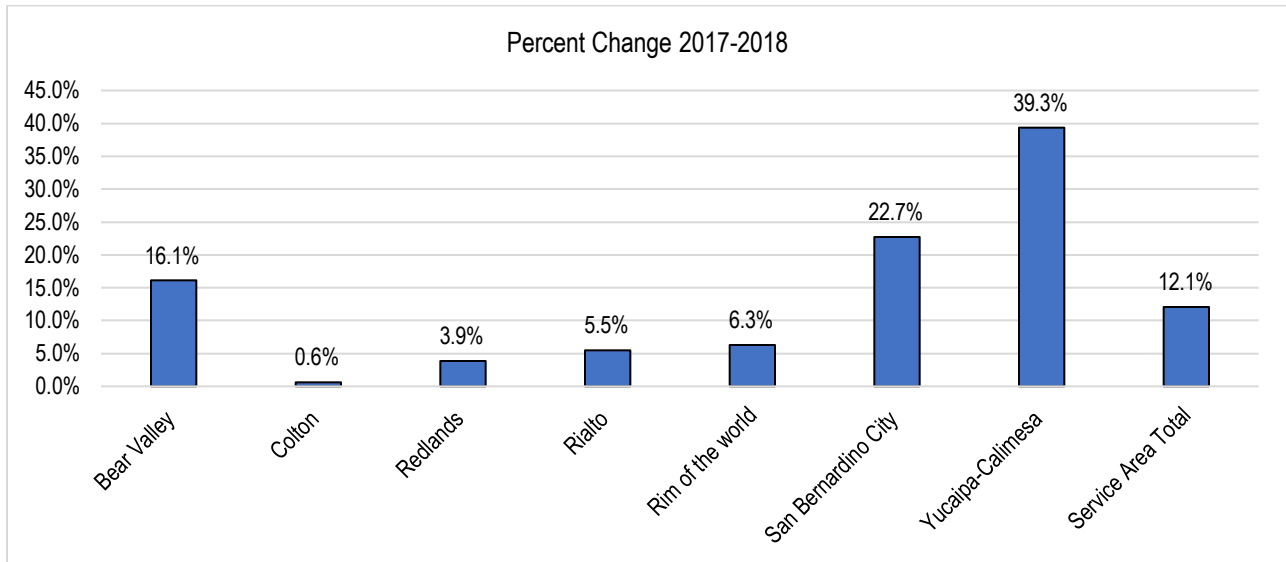

Educational attainment is strongly correlated with median incomes, per the Census Bureau's data. The median annual earning of the residents who hold a high school diploma or did not complete high school was lower than the residents who hold a college degree. The median annual earnings were different among the 10 service area cities. Redlands (\$47,144) and Yucaipa (\$44,816) had the highest median earnings, while San Bernardino (\$27,063), Rialto (\$31,220), and Colton (\$32,141) had the lowest median earnings.

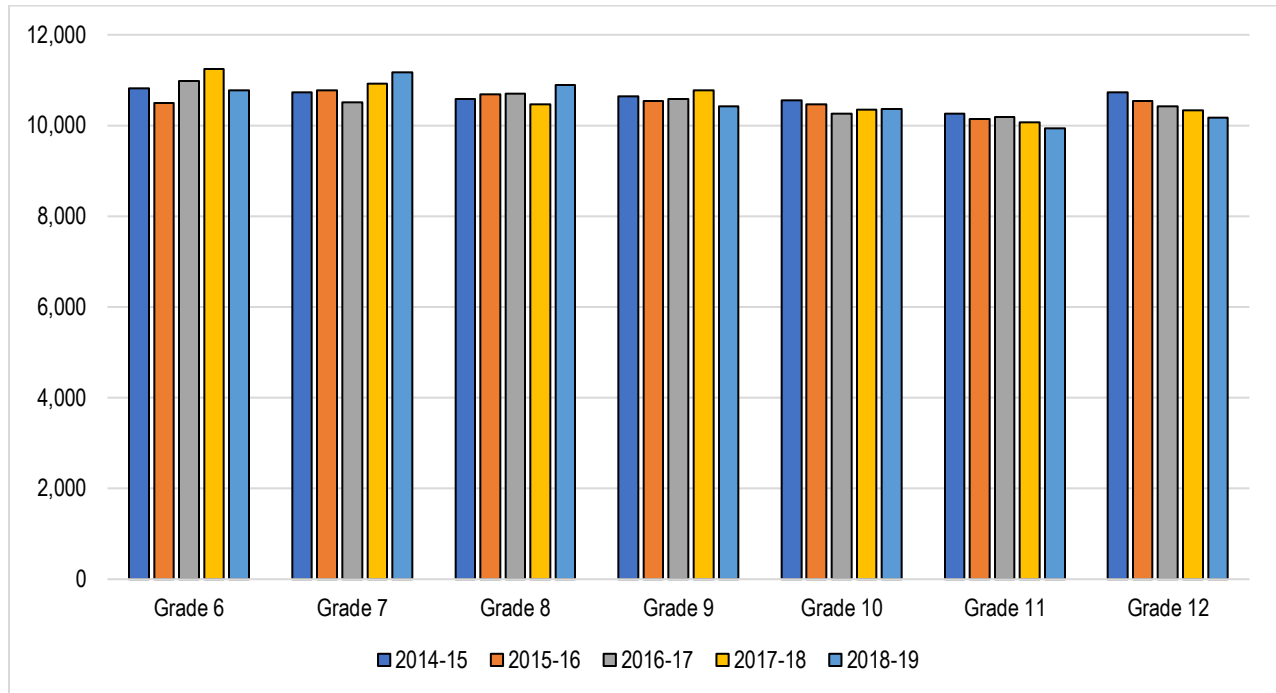
During the 2017-2018 Academic year, 8,837 students graduated from service area high schools. This was an increase of 955 students over the prior academic year. Yucaipa-Calimesa Unified School District (39.3%) had the largest increase in the number of graduates. San Bernardino City (22.7%), Bear Valley (16.1%), Rime of the world (6.3%), and Rialto (5.5%) Unified School Districts followed.

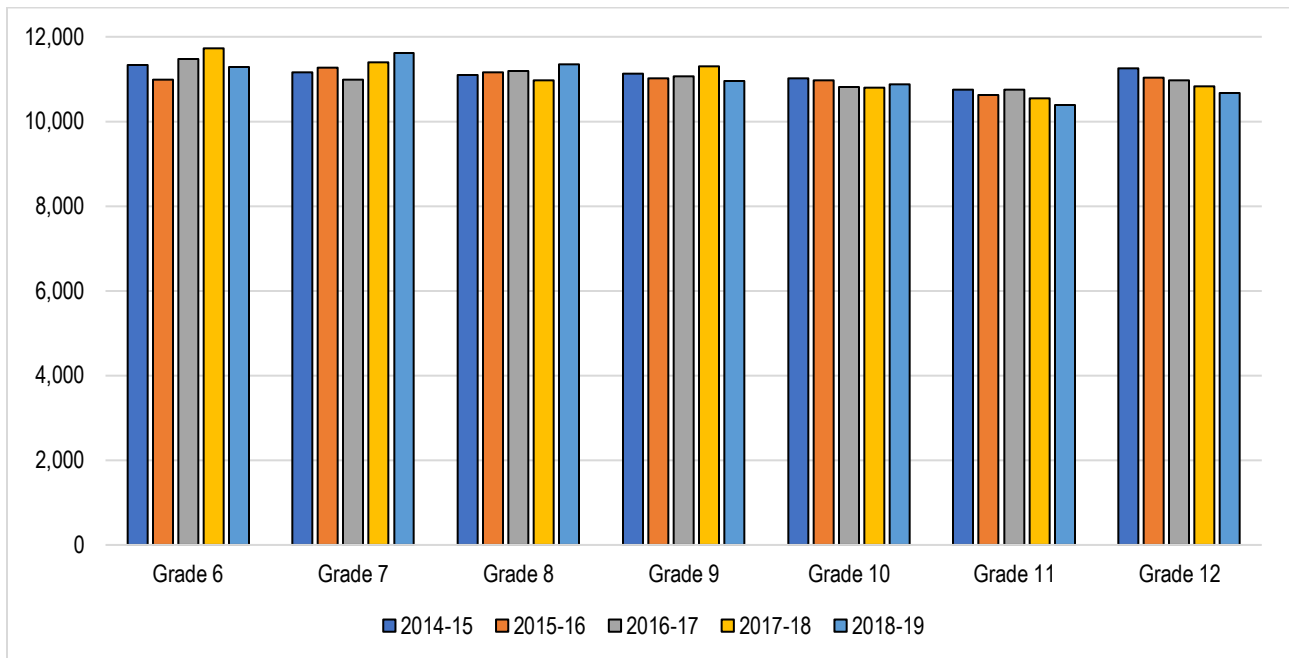
