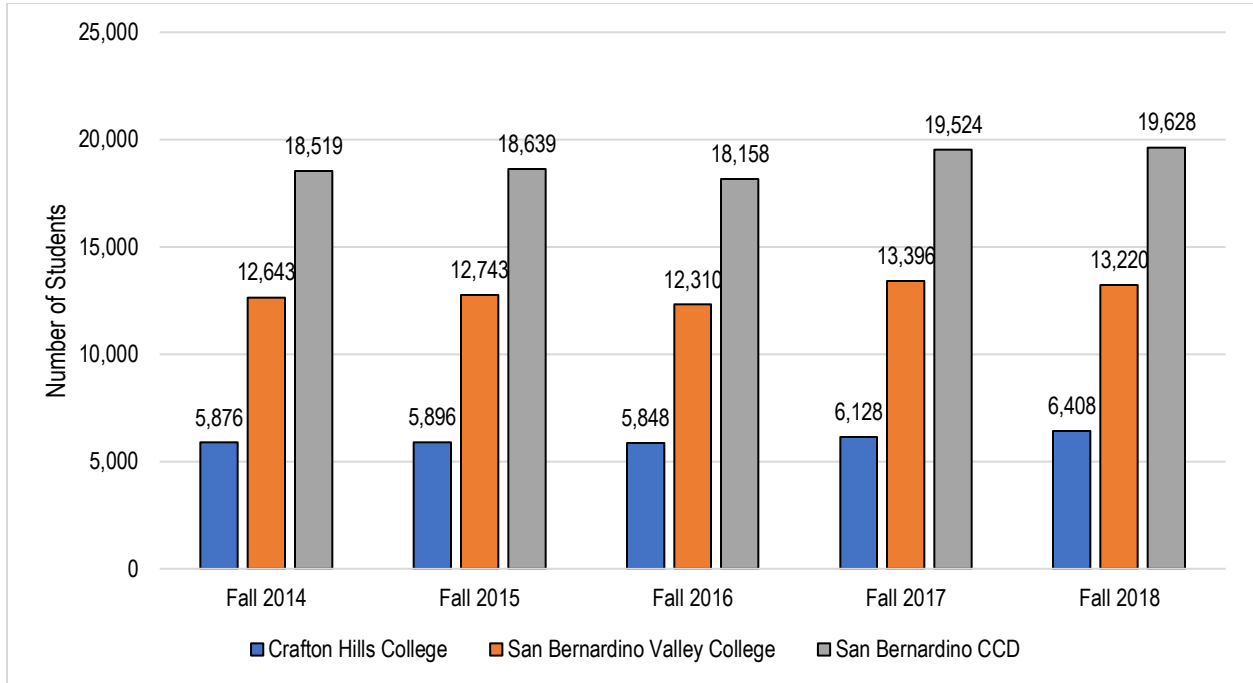

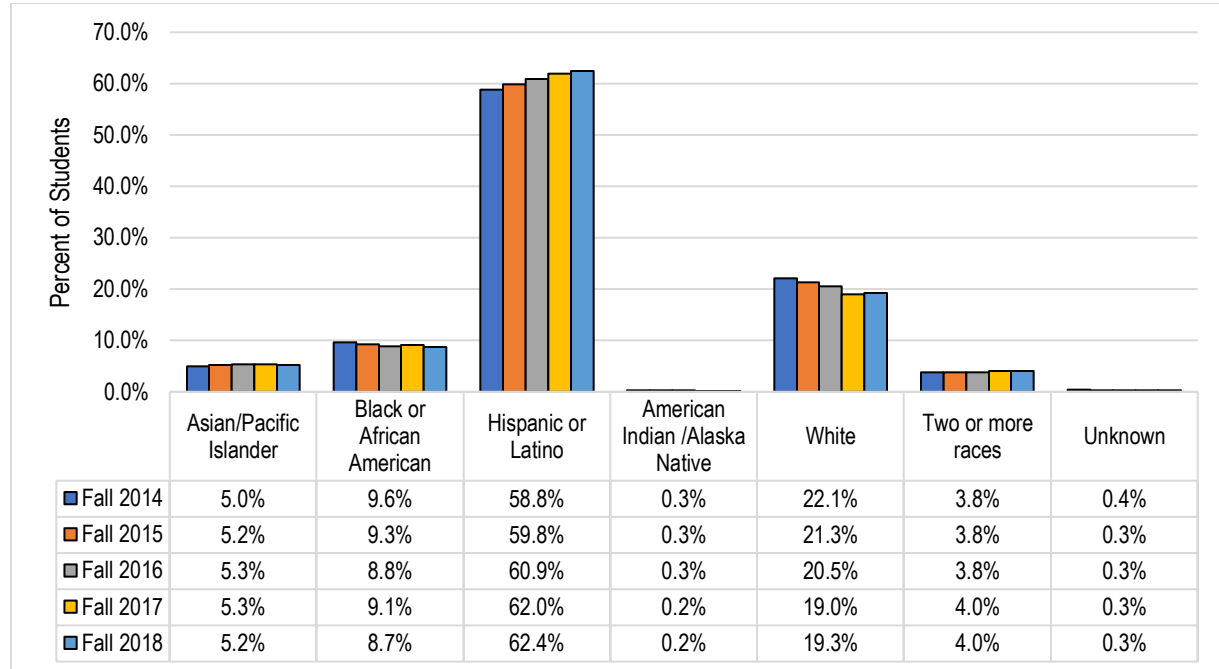

The San Bernardino Community College District student population increased by 6.0% from 18,519 in Fall 2014 to 19,628 in Fall 2018. Overall, San Bernardino Valley College represented 68.1% of the student population and Crafton Hills College represented 31.9% of the student population. An increase in number of students was observed at San Bernardino Valley College (+4.6%) and Crafton Hills College (+9.1%).

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: SBCCD



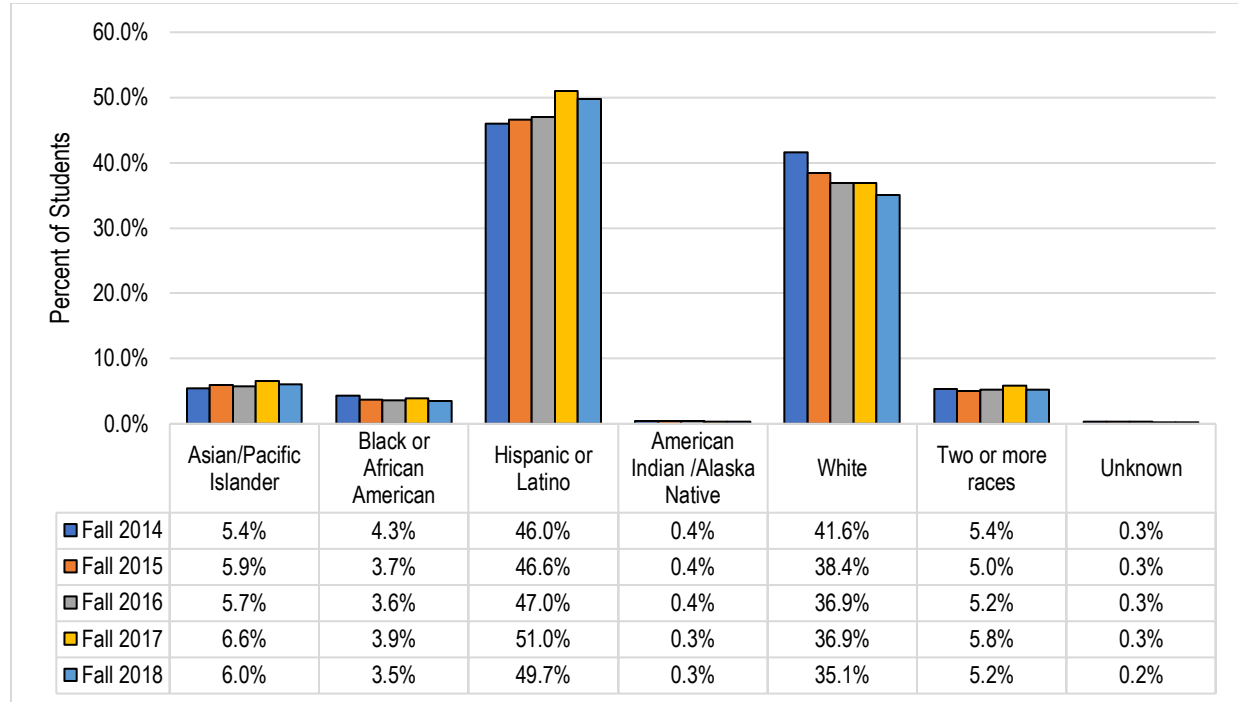

In the Fall 2018 semester, 80.4% of the SBCCD student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, a large increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+1,372), Asian (+105), Two or more race (+69) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for White (-306), African American (-84), Pacific Islander (-26), and American Indian (-7) students.

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: Crafton Hills College



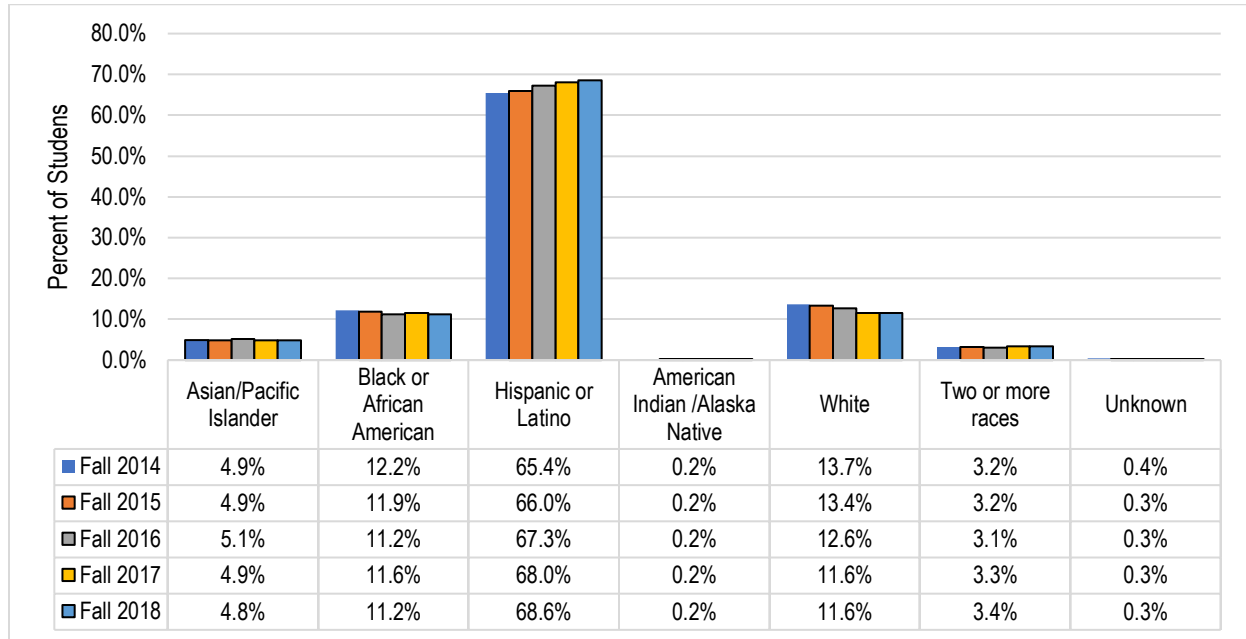

In the Fall 2018 semester, 64.7% of the Crafton Hills College student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, a large increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+573), Asian (+81), and Two or more race (+30) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for White (-117), African American (-21), Pacific Islander (-5), and American Indian (-5) students.

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College



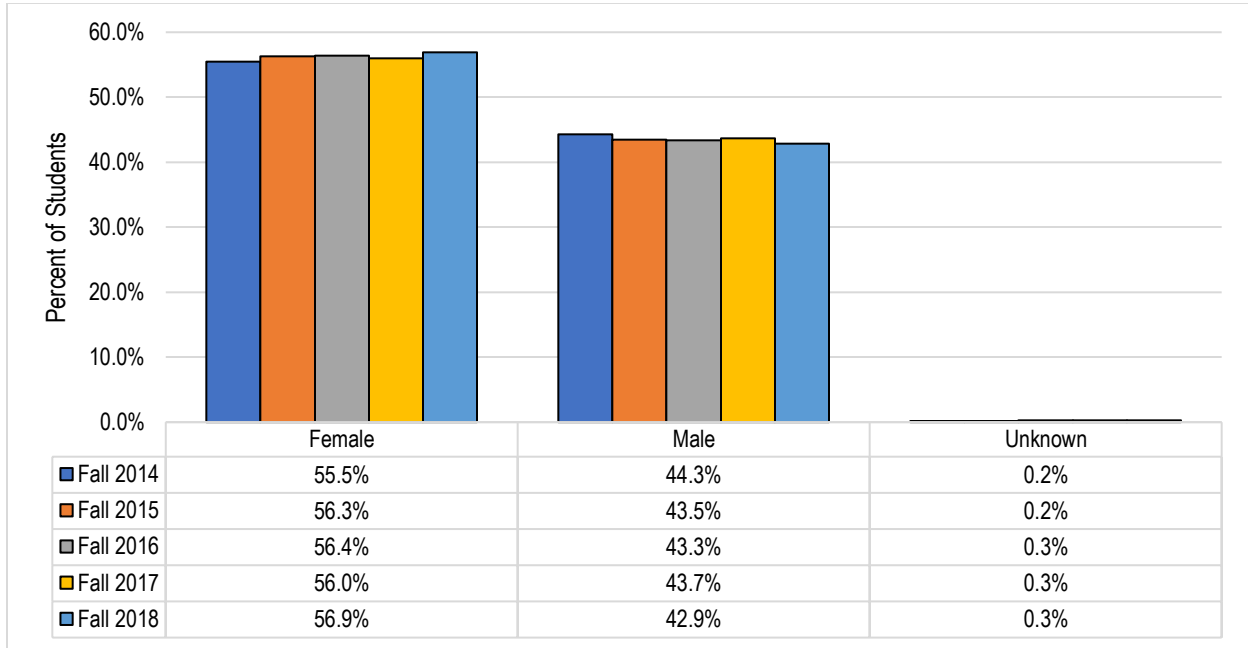

In the Fall 2018 semester, 88.1% of the San Bernardino Valley College student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Two or more race students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, a large increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+799), Two or more race (+39), and Asian (+24) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for White (-189), African American (-63), Pacific Islander (-21), and American Indian (-2) students.

Gender Distribution: SBCCD



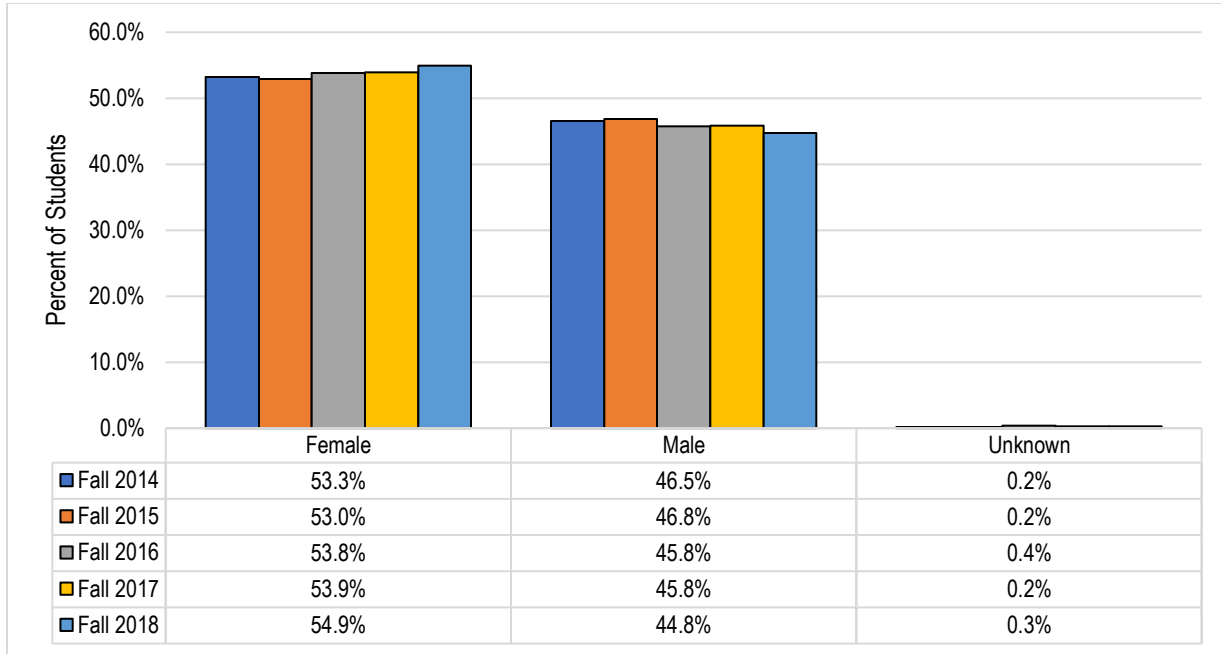

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of female students increased by 1.4% from 55.5% to 56.9%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.4% from 44.3% to 42.9%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 888, from 10,277 in Fall 2014 to 11,165 in Fall 2018, and the number of male students increased by 211, from 8,207 in Fall 2014 to 8,411 in Fall 2018.

Gender Distribution: Crafton Hills College



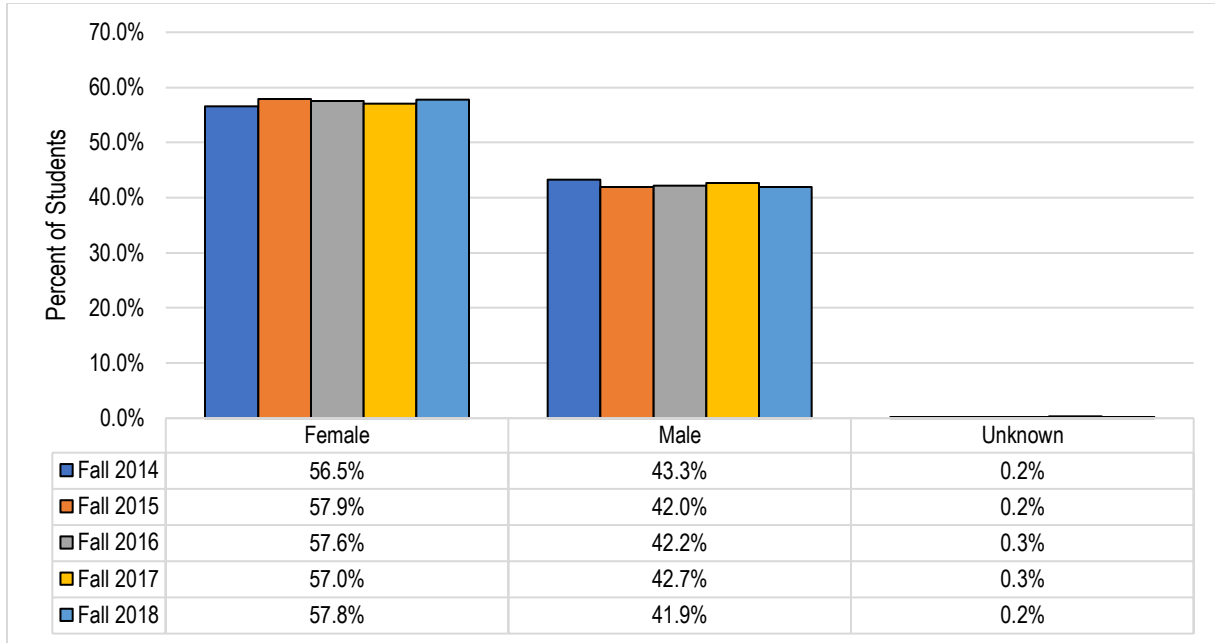

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percent of female students at Crafton Hills College increased by 1.6% from 53.3% to 54.9%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.7% from 46.5% to 44.8%.

Gender Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College



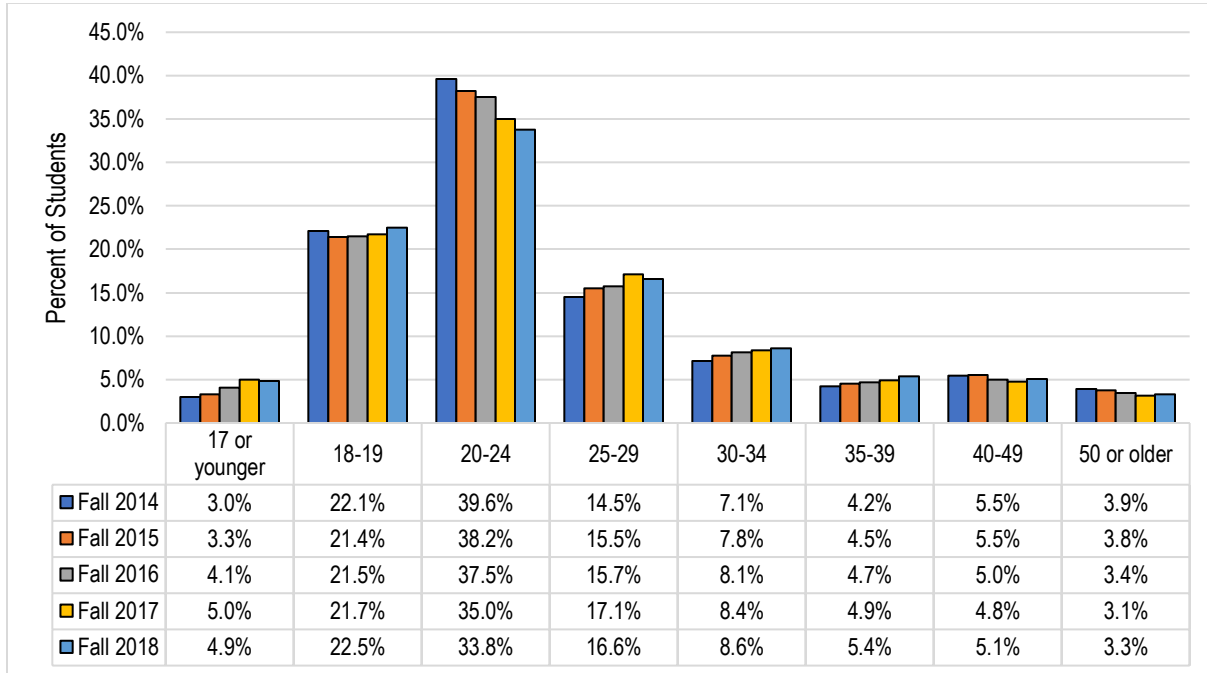

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of female students at San Bernardino Valley College increased by 1.3% from 56.5% to 57.8%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 1.36% from 43.3% to 41.9%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 498, from 7,147 in Fall 2014 to 7,645 in Fall 2018, and the number of male students increased by 70, from 5,473 in Fall 2014 to 5,543 in Fall 2018.

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD



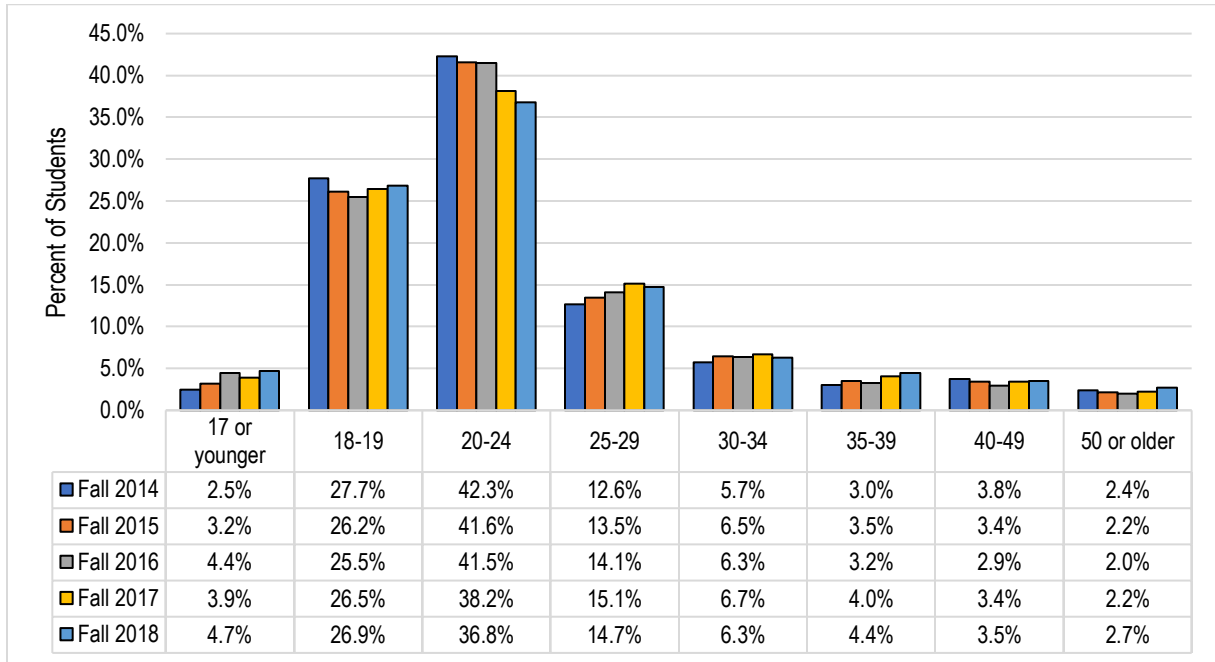

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 5.9% from 39.6% to 33.8%. Over the same period, the percentage of students 25-29 years old increased by 2.1% from 14.5% to 16.6%. The percentage of students under 17 years of age also increased by 1.9% from 3.0% to 4.9%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students 25-29 years of age (+562), students under 17-years-old (+402), students 30-34 years old (+359), and students 35-39-years-old (+270). A decrease was observed among students 25-29 years old (-719) and students 40 years of age or older (-93).

Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College



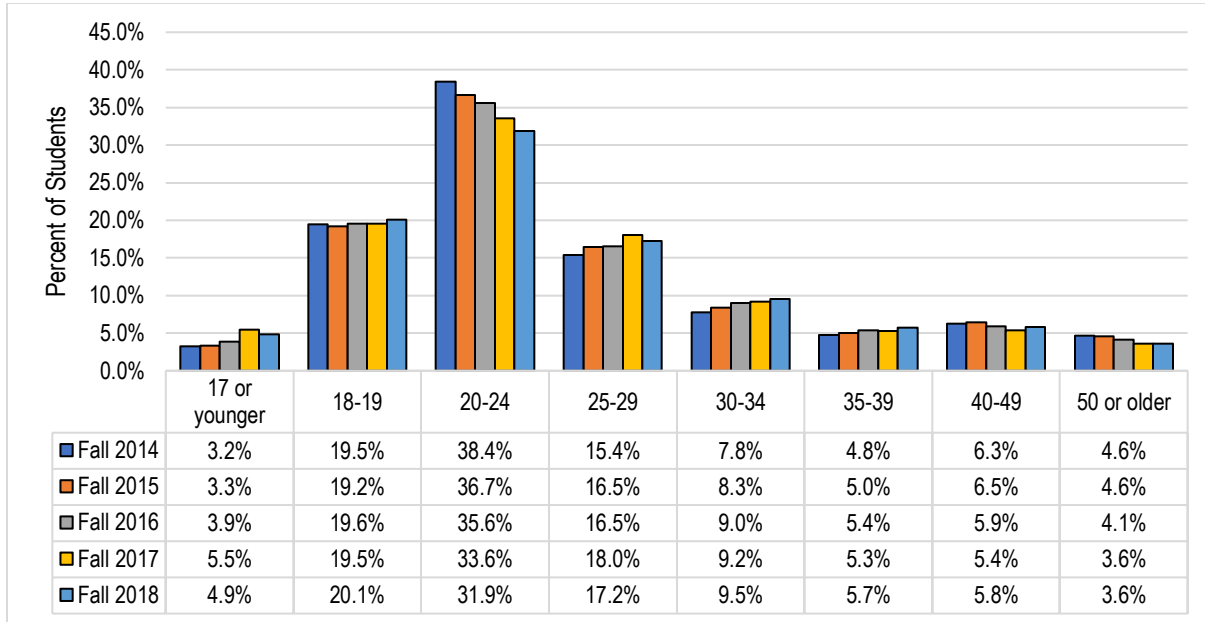

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 5.5% from 42.3% to 36.8%, while the percentage of students under 17-years-old increased by 2.2% from 2.5% to 4.7%. The percentage of students 25-29-years-old also increased by 2.1% from 12.6% to 14.7%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students 25-29 years of age (+200), students under 17-years old (+156), students 35-39 years old (+108), and students 30-34 years old (+68). A decrease was observed among students 20-24 years of age (-128).

Age Range Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College



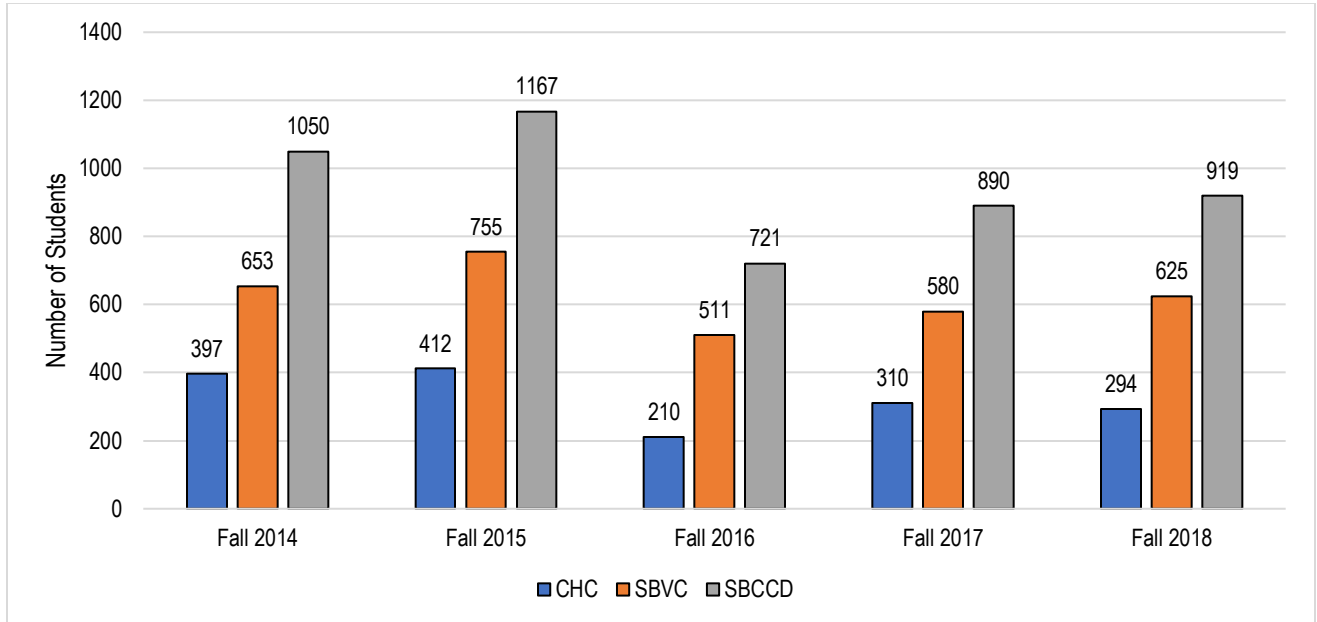

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 6.5% from 38.4% to 31.9%. Over the same period, the percentage of students 25-34 years old increased by 3.5% from 23.2% to 26.7%. The percentage of students under 17 year old increased by 1.7% from 3.2% to 4.9%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students 25-29 years of age (+362), students 30-34 years old (+291), students under 17 years old (+246), students 18-19 years old (+226), and students 35-39 years old (+162). A decrease was observed among students 20-24 years of age (-582) and students 40 years of age or older (-128).

Student Headcount By Disability Status

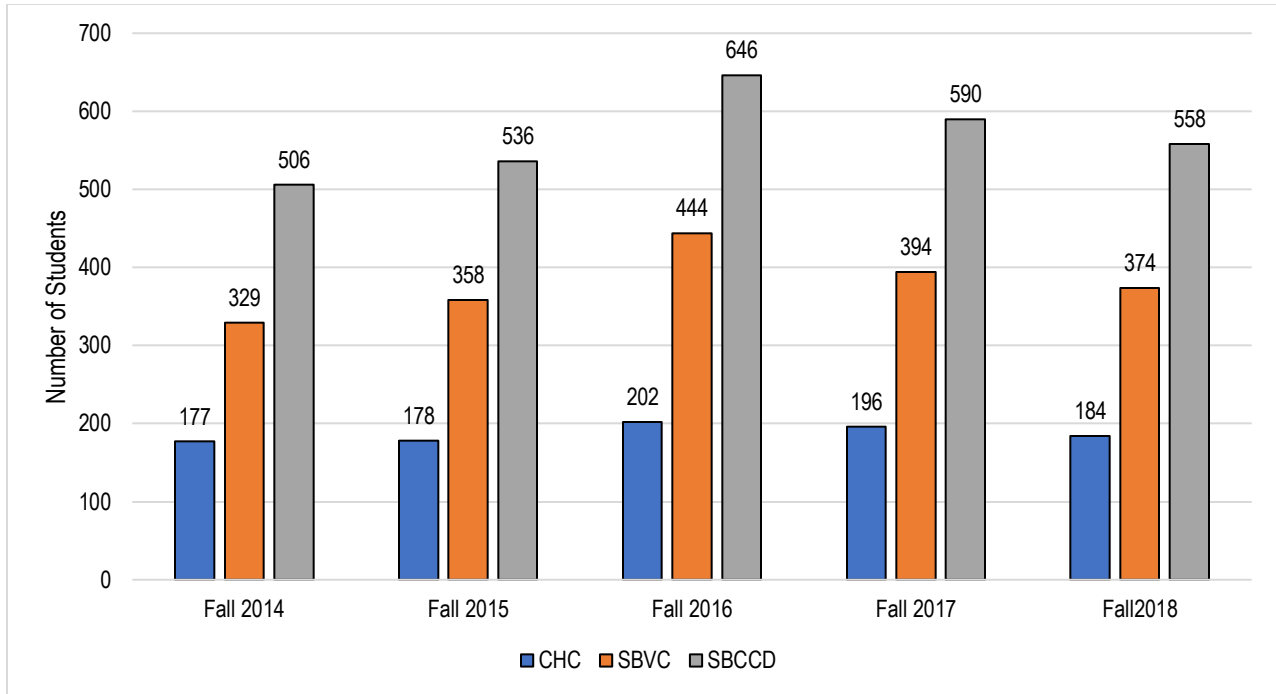

Student Headcount By Veteran Status

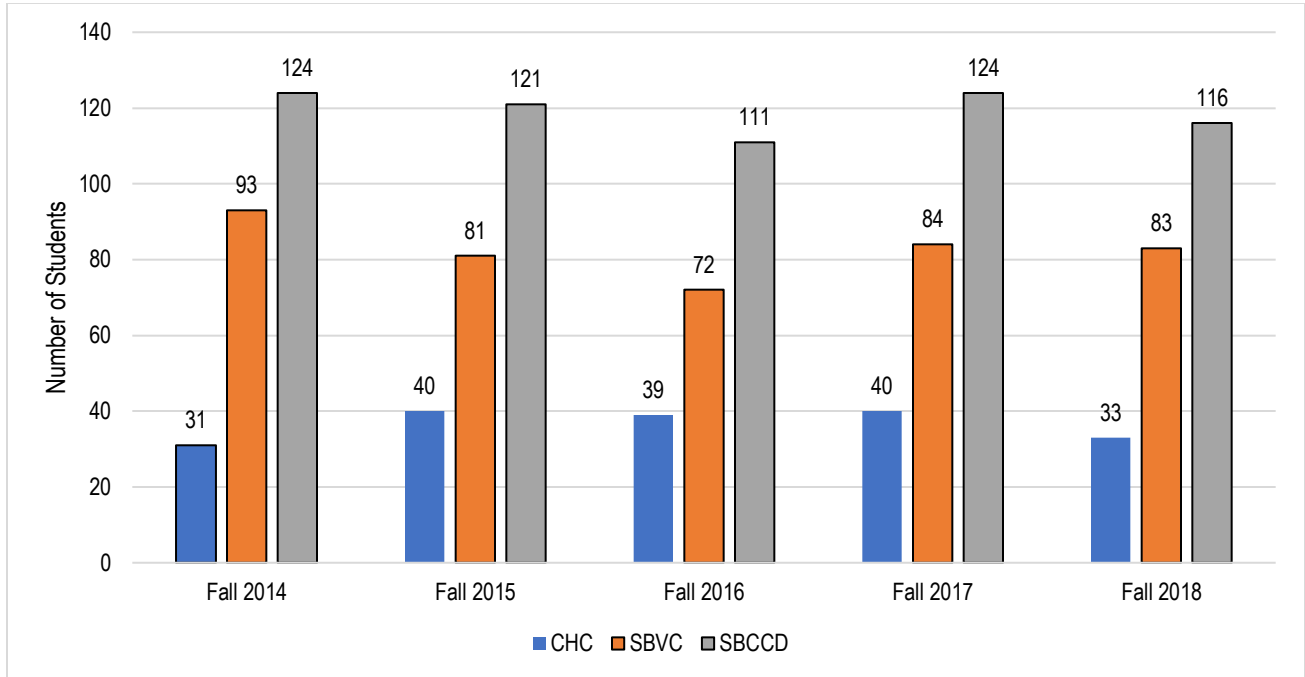

Student Headcount By Foster Youth Status

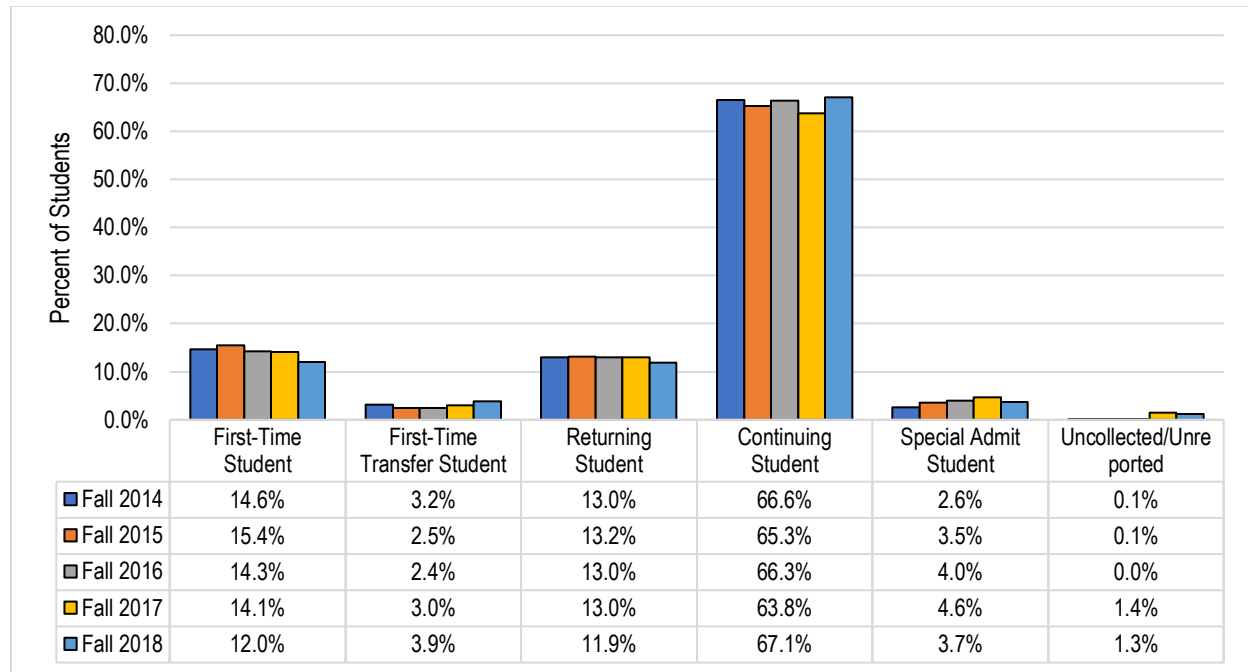

Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: SBCCD



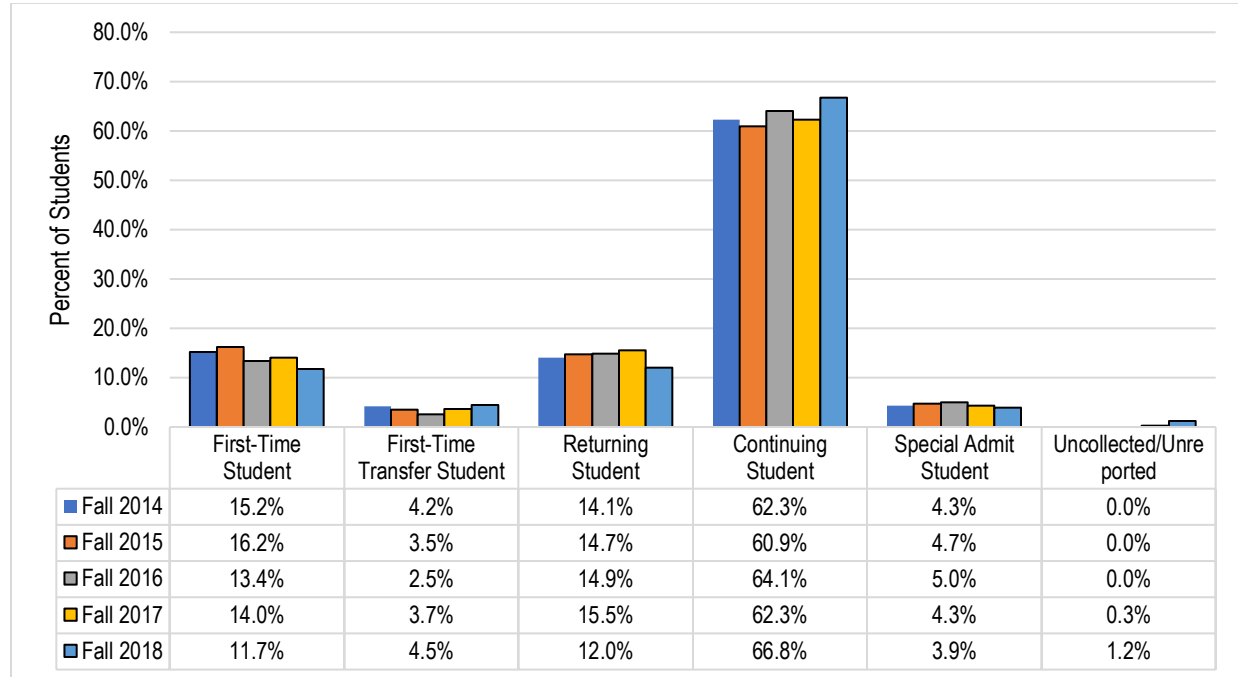

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of continuing students increased by 0.5%, representing 67.1% of the Fall 2018 student population. The percentage of first-time transfer students also increased by 0.7% from 3.2% to 3.9%. However, the percentage of first-time students declined by 2.6% from 14.6% to 12.0%.

The percentage of the term unduplicated student population represented by special admit students has increased by 1.1%, from 2.6% in Fall 2014 to 3.7% in Fall 2018. The number of special admit students rose to 729 (255 more students, a 53.8% increase).

Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: Crafton Hills College



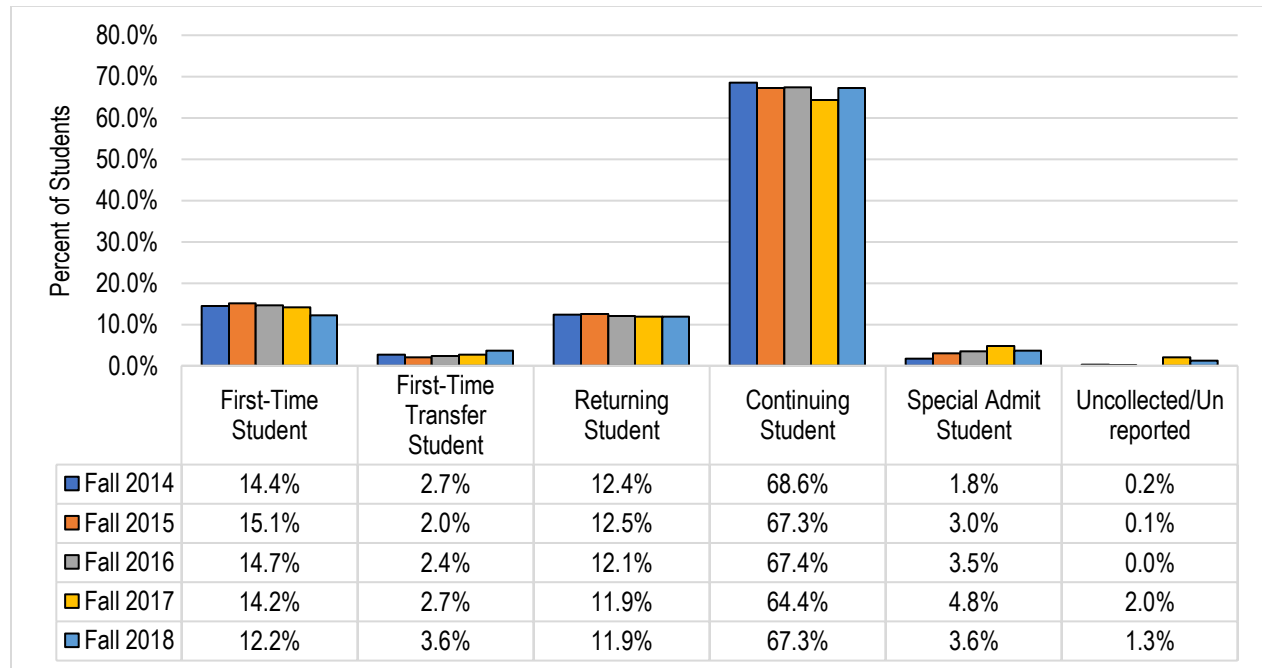

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of continuing students at Crafton Hills College increased by 4.5%, representing 66.8% of the Fall 2018 student population. Over the same period, the percentage of first-time students declined by 3.5% from 15.2% to 11.7%. The percentage of returning students also declined by 2.1%, representing 12.0% of the Fall 2018 student population.

An increase in the number of students was observed among continuing students (+617), and first-time transfer students (+45). A decrease was observed among first time students (-141), returning students (-62), and special admit students (-3).

Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: San Bernardino Valley College



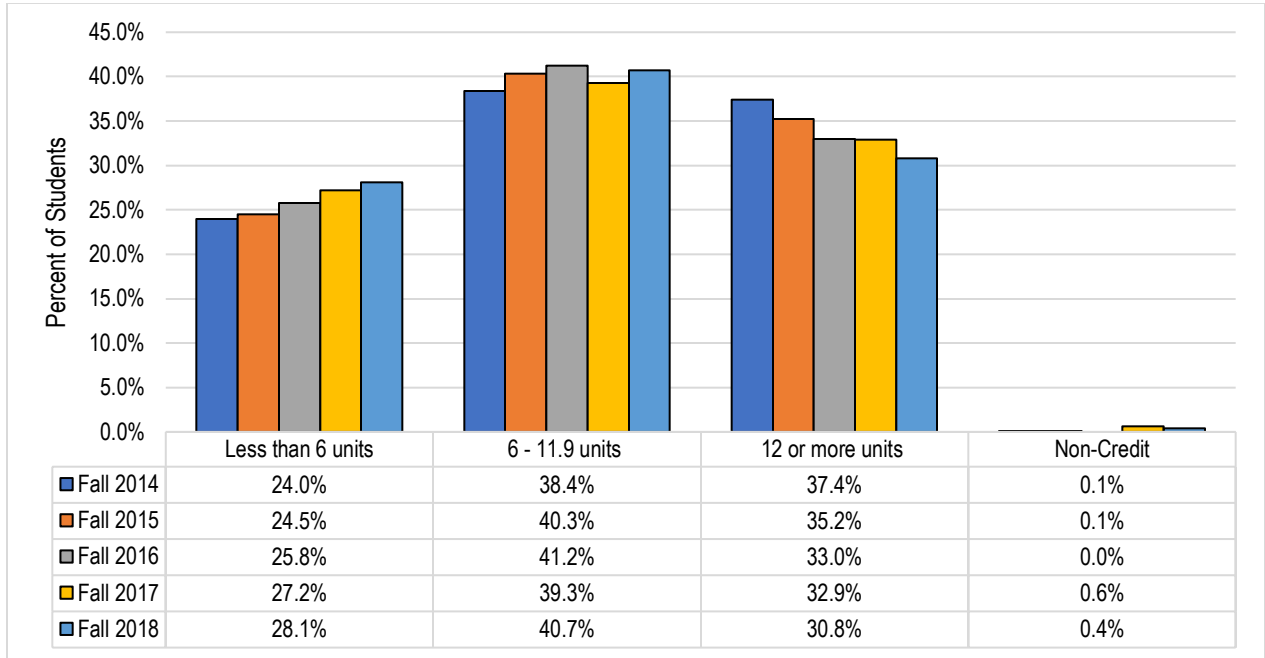

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of continuing students at San Bernardino Valley College declined by 1.2%, representing 67.3% of the Fall 2018 student population. The percentage of first-time college students also declined by 2.2% from 14.4% to 12.2%. Over the same period, the percentage of special admit and of first-time transfer students increased (1.8% and 0.9%, respectively).

An increase in the number of students was observed among special admit students (+258), continuing students (+233), first time transfer students (+135), and returning students (+4). A decrease was observed among first-time students (-206).

Student Headcount By Full-time/Part-time Status (Unit Load): SBCCD



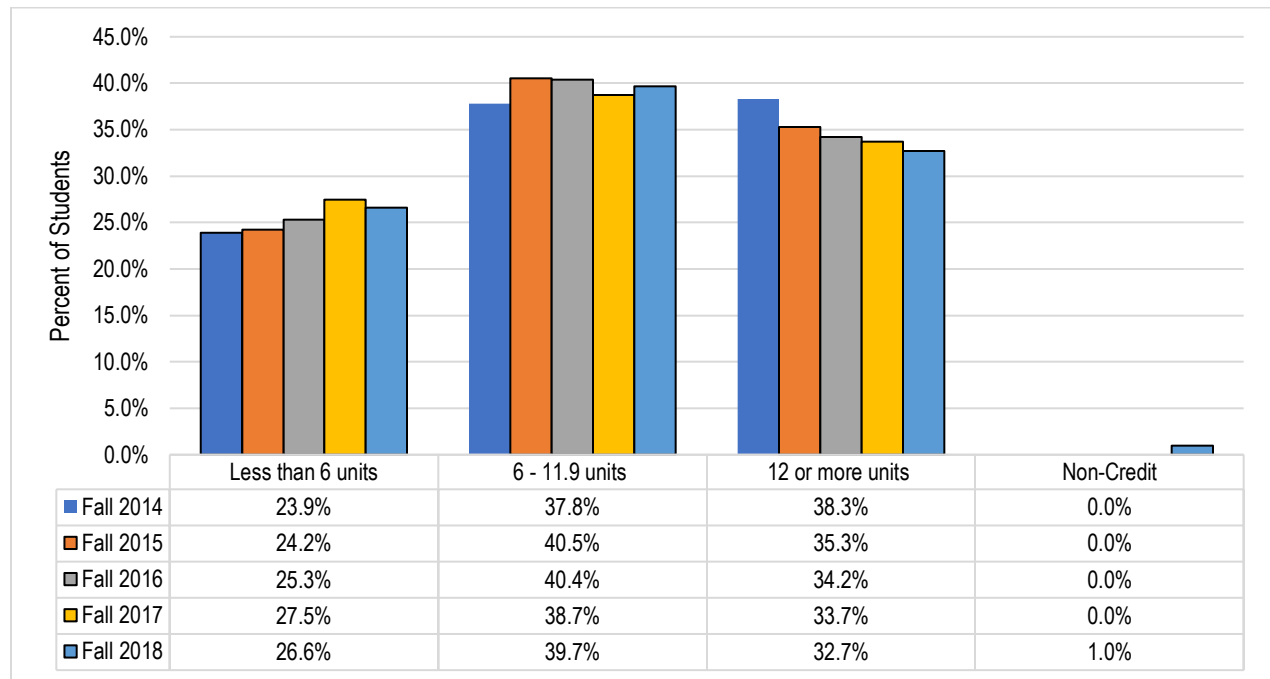

Between Fall 2014 and Fall 2018, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units declined by 6.6%, representing 30.8% of the Fall 2018 student population. The percentage of students taking less than 6 units increased by 4.1% from 24.0% to 28.1%. The percentage of students taking 6-11.9 units also increased by 2.3% from 38.4% to 40.7%.

A large increase in the number of students was observed among students taking less than 6 units (+1,076), students taking 6.0-11.9 units (+867), and students taking Non-Credit courses (+51). Over the same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed among students taking 12 or more units (-885).

Student Headcount By Full-time/Part-time Status (Unit Load): Crafton Hills College



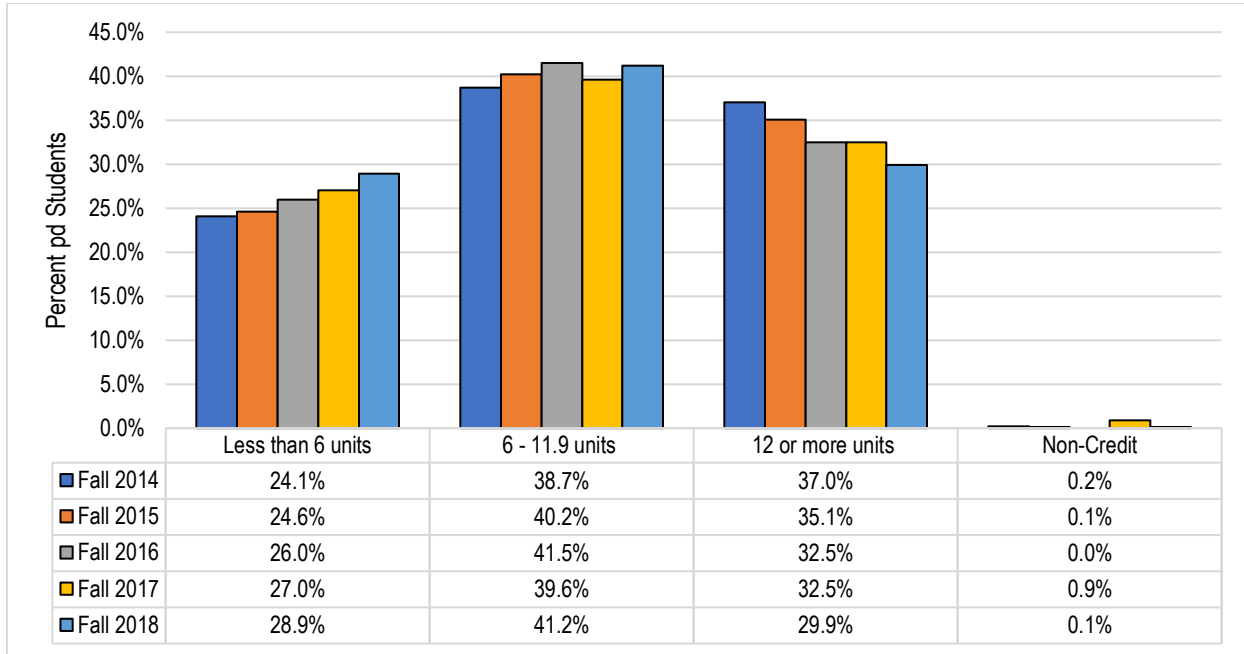

Student Headcount By Full-time/Part-time (Unit Load): San Bernardino Valley College



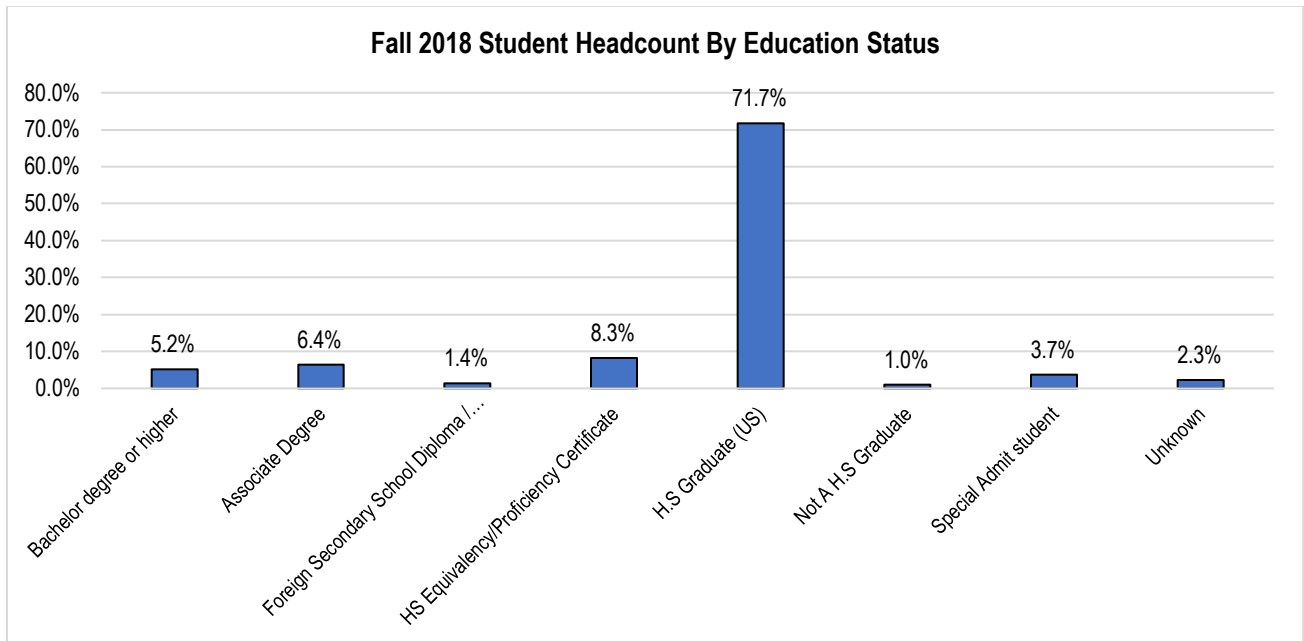

Student Headcount By Education Status: SBCCD

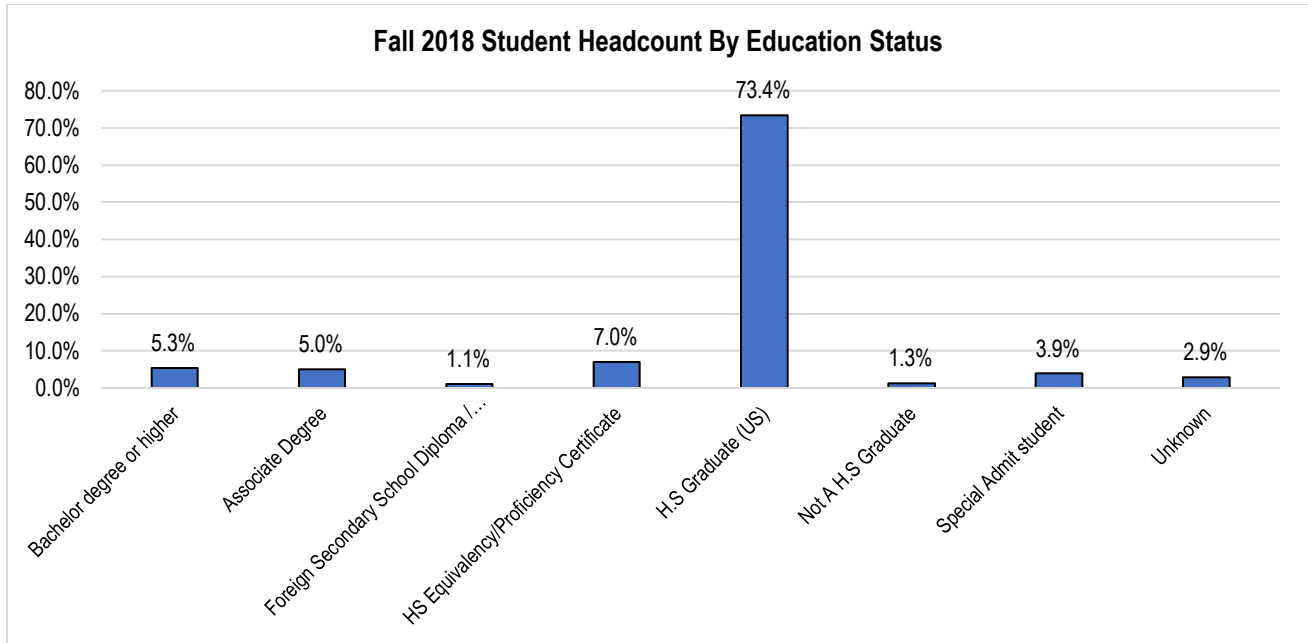

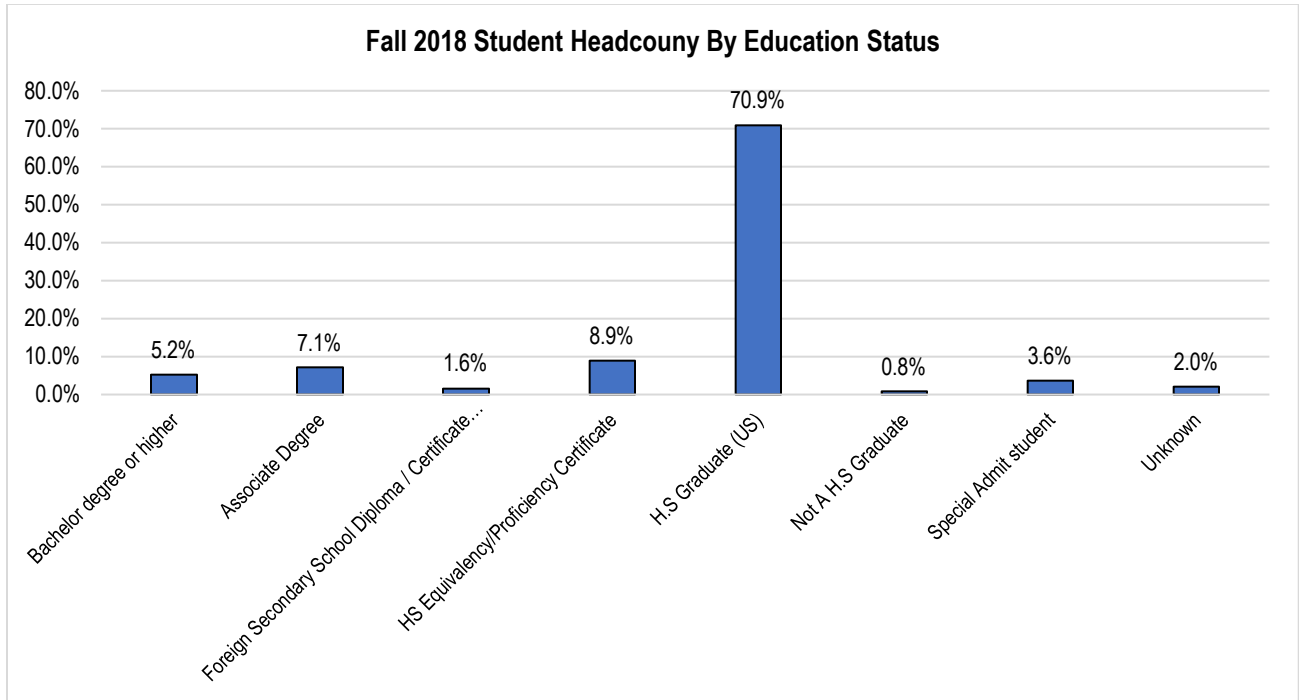

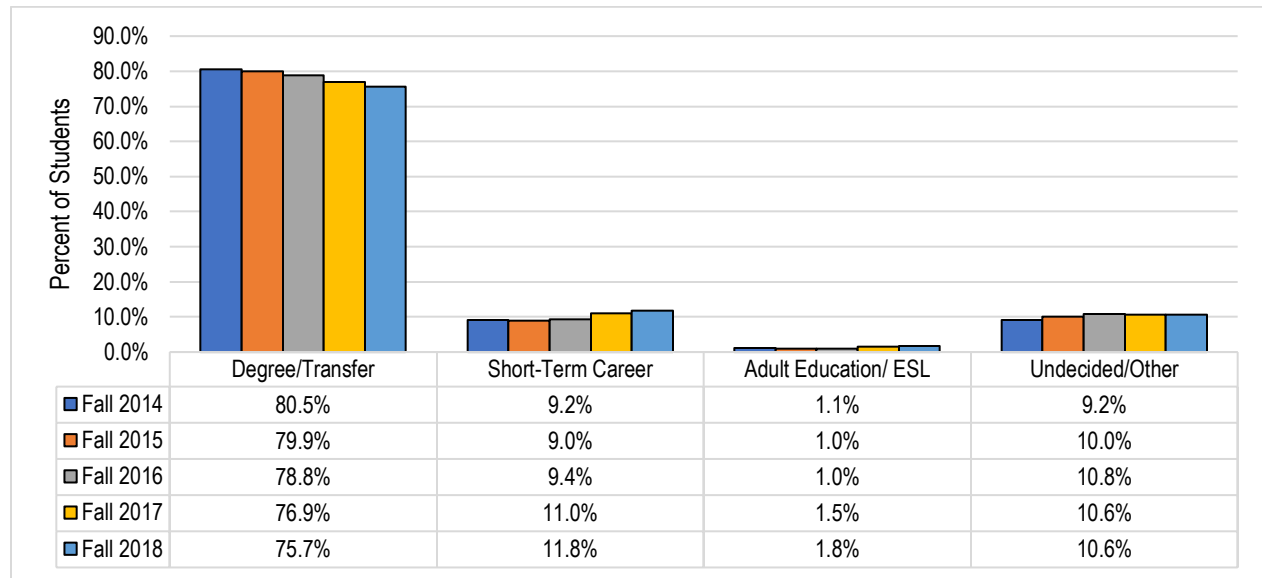

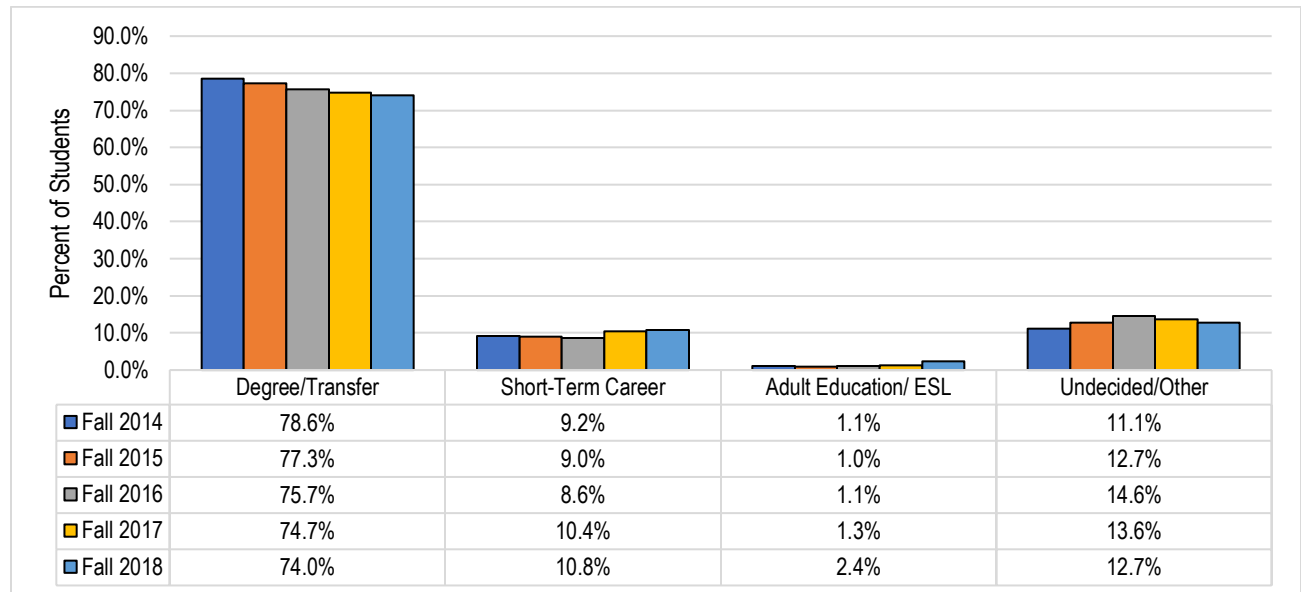
