



The San Bernardino Community College District student population increased by 11.2% from 18,639 in Fall 2015 to 20,727 in Fall 2019. Overall, San Bernardino Valley college represented 68.2% of the student population and Crafton Hills college represented 31.8% of the student population. An increase in number of students was observed at San Bernardino Valley College (+11.7%) and Crafton Hills College (+10.2%).

Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: SBCCD





In the Fall 2019 semester, 81.4% of the SBCCD student population were from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups. Over the past five years, there has been an increase in Hispanic and Asian students and a decrease in White and African American students.

Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019, the greatest increase in the number of students was observed among Hispanic (+2,048), Asian (+125), Two or more race (+106) students. Over this same period, a decrease in the number of students was observed for White (-391), African American (-29), and American Indian/Alaska Native (-7) students.

Gender Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019, the percentage of female students increased by 0.6% from 56.3% to 56.9%, while the percentage of male students decreased by 0.7% from 43.5% to 42.8%.

Over the past five years, the number of female students increased by 1298, from 10,495 in Fall 2015 to 11,793 in Fall 2019, and the number of male students increased by 711, from 8,109 in Fall 2015 to 8,880 in Fall 2019.

Age Range Distribution: SBCCD





Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019, the percentage of students 20-24 years of age declined by 6.0% from 38.2% to 32.2%. Over the same period, the percentage of students under 17 years of age increased by 3.0% from 3.3% to 6.3%. The percentage of students 18-19 years old also increased by 2.3% from 21.4% to 23.7%.

An increase in the number of students was observed among students 18-19 years of age (+928), students under 17-years-old (+691), students 25-29-years-old (+393), students 30-34-years-old (+274), students 35-39-years-old (+245), and students 40-49-years-old (+27). A decrease was observed among students 20-24-years-old (-457) and students 50 years of age or older (-13).







Student Headcount By Enrollment Status: SBCCD





Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019, the percentage of first-time students increased by 12.8%, representing 28.2% of the Fall 2019 student population. However, the percentage of continuing students declined by 9.2% from 65.3% to 56.1%. The percentage of returning students also declined by 3.6% from 13.2% to 9.6%.

The percentage of the term unduplicated student population represented by special admit students has increased by 0.8%, from 3.5% in Fall 2015 to 4.3% in Fall 2019. The number of special admit students rose to 886 (226 more students, a 34.2% increase).







Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019, the percentage of students taking 12 or more units declined by 1.3%, representing 33.9% of the Fall 2019 student population. The percentage of students taking 6-11.9 units also declined by 2.7% from 40.3% to 37.6%. Over the same period, the percentage of students taking less than 6 units increased by 3.4% from 24.5% to 27.9%.

The greatest increase in the number of students was observed among students taking less than 6 units (+1,220), students taking 12 or more units (+490), students taking 6.0-11.9 units (+290), and students taking Non-Credit courses (+102).

Student Headcount By Education Status: SBCCD





Number of Students Receiving Financial Aid Awards By Award Type: SBCCD







Between 2015-16 and 2019-20, the percentage of students awarded financial aid decreased by 9.1%, representing 60.2% of the 2019-20 student population. The number of students receiving finical aid decreased by 2.3%, from 17,550 to 17,144. An increase was observed among students who received SEOG (+271), Chaffe Grants (+10), and Scholarships (+65). During this same period, a decrease was observed among students who received Pell Grants (-811), California College Promise Grants (-499), Cal Grants (-9), Care Grants (-4), Work Study (-29), and Loans (-17).


Between 2015-16 and 2019-20, the total number of students that received financial aid increased by 2.7%, from \$40,363,854 to \$41,436,444. Largest increases were observed in SEOG Grants (+75.4%), Chaffe Grants (+73.3%), Cal grant (+58.6%), Scholarships (+82.2. %), and Work study (+6.7%). Largest decreases were observed in California College Promise Grant (-7.3%), Pell Grants (-2.2%), and Loans (-23.1%).





Gender Distribution: Crafton Hills College





Age Range Distribution: Crafton Hills College







Student Headcount By Full-time/Part-time Status (Unit Load): Crafton Hills College







Racial/Ethnicity Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College





Gender Distribution: San Bernardino Valley College






Student Headcount By Education Status: San Bernardino Valley College




Student Headcount By Educational Goal: San Bernardino Valley College


Between 2015-16 and 2019-20, the percentage of SBVC students receiving financial aid declined by 11.0%, representing 65.5% of the 2019-20 SBVC student population. Between 2015-16 and 2019-20, the total number of students that received financial aid increased by 5.6% from \$31,168,315 to \$32,910,312. Largest increases were observed in Chaffe Grants (+87.0%), Cal Grant (+73.0%), Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG) (+67.1%), California College Promise Grants (+3.7%), Scholarships (+73.6%), and Work study (+0.7%). Largest decreases were observed in CARE Grants (-38.5%), Pell Grants (-10.2%), and Loans (-26.6%).
