

Fall Semester Full-Time/Part-Time Student Status: 2012 to 2017


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INTRODUCTION

This research brief looks at the percent of full-time and part-time students enrolled at San Bernardino Community College District (SBCCD) and its campuses, Crafton Hills College (CHC) and San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) each Fall semester from 2012 to 2017. A part-time student is defined as a student attempting fewer than 12 units in the given semester.

From Fall 2012 to Fall 2014, the district saw a rise in the percent of full-time students. Beginning Fall 2015, the district has seen a decline in the percent of full-time students, with stabilization in Fall 2017. Overall, from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, the number of full-time students has gone from a high of 37.5% to a low of 33.0%. The average unit load saw a high of 8.26 units in Fall 2013 and a low of 8.01 units in Fall 2017.

Looking at Unit Load Distributions (Table 2, next page), most ranges have maintained an overall consistency. Students attempting 6 to 8.9 units saw the greatest rise (20.6% in Fall 2012 to 22.8% in Fall 2017), while students attempting 12 to 14.9 units saw the greatest decline (26.7% in Fall 2012 to 22.9% in Fall 2017).




From Fall 2012 to Fall 2014, CHC saw a rise in the percent of full-time students. Beginning Fall 2015, CHC has seen a decline in the percent of full-time students. Overall, from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, the number of full-time students has gone from a high of 38.3% to a low of 33.7%. The average number of units attempted saw a high of 8.44 units in Fall 2014 and a low of 8.07 units in Fall 2017.

Looking at Unit Load Distributions (Table 4, next page), students taking less that 3 units saw a high of 3.7% in Fall 2012 and a low of 1.7% in Fall 2016, rising to 2.8% in Fall 2017. Students taking 3 to 5.9 units rose from a low of 20.9% in Fall 2013 to a high of 24.7% in Fall 2017. Students taking 6 to 8.9 units reached a high of 24.3% in Fall 2016, dropping to 21.5% in Fall 2017. Students taking 9 to 11.9 units remained fairly consistent, seeing a low of 16.0% in Fall 2014 and a high of 17.3% in Fall 2017.

For students taking 12 or more units, those taking 12 to 14.9 units saw a high of 28.6% in Fall 2013 and a low of 24.0% in Fall 2017. Students taking 15 or more units remained fairly consistent, seeing a high of 10.7% in Fall 2014 and a low of 9.4% in Fall 2016.




From Fall 2012 to Fall 2014, SBVC saw a rise in the percent of full-time students. Beginning Fall 2015, SBVC has seen a decline in the percent of full-time students, with stabilization in Fall 2017. Overall, from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, the number of full-time students has gone from a high of 37.1% to a low of 32.5%. The average number of units attempted saw a high of 8.03 units in Fall 2014 and a low of 7.76 units in Fall 2017.


Looking at Unit Load Distributions (Table 6, next page), students taking less that 3 units saw a high of 2.3% in Fall 2013, the only term this rate was above two percent. Students taking 3 to 5.9 units dropped from a high of 25.9% in Fall 2012 to a low of 22.2% in Fall 2014 to return to 25.7% by Fall 2017. Students taking 6 to 8.9 units have been on the rise, starting at 20.7% in Fall 2012, peaking at 25.2% in Fall 2016, and ending at 23.4% in Fall 2017. Students taking 9 to 11.9 units remained very consistent, ranging between a low of 16.1% and a high of 16.8% during the six Fall semesters.

For students taking 12 or more units, those taking 12 to 14.9 units saw a high of 28.0% in Fall 2014 and a low of 22.4% in Fall 2017. Students taking 15 or more units remained fairly consistent overall, seeing a high of 10.2% in Fall 2017 from a low of 7.8% in Fall 2016.
