












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
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# Educational Attainment 2010-2015 (5-Yr. Average)



# **Regional Program Surplus – Certificate Level**

Crafton Hills Emergency Medical Services Program – 286 Surplus
 Produces 123 completers per year for 61 annual openings
 Other regional institutions add another 1,904 completers per year

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# **Regional Program Gaps – Associate Level**

- Business Administration = 827 Gap
- Child Development / Early Care Education = 372 Gap
