


SBVC Service Area










Historical Population

- Service Area was 31.2% of Regional population in 2015










Population Projection




- Regional Growth 2016-2025 = 5.7% (263,910 persons)


















Educational Attainment 2010-2015 (5-Yr. Average)










Median Income by Educational Attainment 2010-2015 (5-Yr Average)
